

Hazelwick School GCSE Results

Summer 2019

Hazelwick students again produced outstanding GCSE results with Year 11 rising to the challenge of the more difficult GCSE's. Our students achieved an excellent Progress 8 outcome, +0.47, maintaining Hazelwick's place as one of the top state schools, for GCSE outcomes, in the county.

In addition to the superb progress shown by our students, nearly one quarter achieved the English Baccalaureate, based on the new tougher 9-5 measure across all the Baccalaureate subjects, compared to a figure of 19.5% achieved nationally in 2018 using the standard 9-4 measure. Combined with an impressive 25% of grades at 9-7 (A*-A) level, including fifty one students who achieved in excess of five grades at this level, we are very proud of our students' superb achievements, which is a fitting reward for the hard work and commitment shown.

Thirty eight students achieved seven or more 9-7 (A*-A), including an amazing nine perfect grades (grade 9) by two students; Nuha Abdul Latiff and Saptarshi Bandyopadhyay.
