


Yours From the Tower by Sally Nicholls

Once, I escaped from an orphanage to find Mum and Dad.


Once, I saved a girl called Zelda from a burning house.

One by one, the boys begin to fall...


In 1914 a room full of German schoolboys, fresh-faced and

Set during the English Civil War, this is the story is told by Coriander, daughter of a silk merchant.

They shut Coriander away in a chest and leave her to die, but she emerges into the fairy world from which her mother came. Here, time has no meaning. When she returns, she is 17 and is charged with a task that will transform her life...

She tattooed her name on my heart.


In 1942, Lale Sokolov arrived in

Growing up poor but proud on



Flavia Gemina, a Roman sea captain's daughter, is about to embark on a thrilling adventure.


